Dear Parents and Guardians,

As we return from the hustle and bustle of Christmas and swing back into the education setting, I want to take this opportunity to wish you and your families a very Happy New Year and all the best that 2016 has to offer. Here at Saint Dominic Academy the focus for the next few weeks will be on midterm examinations and then, the successful beginning of the second semester of the school year.

The integration of the Writing Across the Curriculum program has progressed to full use in each of our departments, with students writing Type I through Type V on all grade levels in all classes. All midterm examinations will include a writing section, and all Math and English examinations on the 9th - 11th grade levels will contain a section focusing on the new PSAT and SAT.

All fall, we have seen evidence here at SDA of new and exciting curricular ventures. The Kindle Fire program has been integrated into the 9th and 10th grade Honors English classes and the use of IPADS has been fully integrated into the 9th grade classes as well. Students on the 10th, 11th and 12th grade level are seeing increased technology use in their classrooms as well. Partnering with Liberty Science Center right before Halloween, our 7th and 8th grade students were able to participate in a Cow's Eye Dissection through a grant program. Although squeamish at first, they eventually really enjoyed the experience. Some of our English and History classes partnered with the Library of Congress to participate in their Story Corps project, and all Math and English classes have started to use the Khan Academy website, in conjunction with The College Board in order to prepare for the new SAT, coming in March 2016.

In the coming months, we will be hosting a College Admissions Panel for our 10th and 11th grade students and parents, on the evening of February 4th and will be welcoming the Shakespeare Theatre of New Jersey in March for a production of Romeo and Juliet. It will be a semester full of surprises and fun and I am thankful daily that I am able to share in these educational endeavors with your daughters!

Glee Club Celebrates New Year in Rome

As members of *Pueri Cantores*, the official student choral organization of the Catholic Church, many members of the Glee Club participated in Pueri Cantores' 40th International Congress held recently in Rome, Italy. They left for Rome on December 26 and sang on four separate occasions while there. During the Opening Ceremony, they marched from the Castel Sant'Angelo down the Via Conciliazione to Saint Peter's Basilica where they marched through the Holy Door which has been opened for the Jubilee Year. They then sang with all American and Irish choirs for the *Mass of Nations* at the Basilica of Saint John Lateran. New Year's Eve and New Year's Day were the climax of the trip. On December 31, the Glee Club sang at Sala Nervi in a performance in honor of the Holy Father, "*Christmas Around the World*." The international choirs serenaded Pope Francis with the Argentinean Carol "*El Naciemiento*."

At 10:00 A.M. on New Year's Day, the Glee Club sang in the World Peace Day Papal Mass and then gathered for *Angelus* in St. Peter's Square. The girls returned home on January 2nd with memories to last a lifetime.

Later in the year, on April 25, 2016, members of the Glee Club will join the Dominoes in a performance of Antonio Vivaldi's "Gloria" in Carnegie Hall.

Blue Devils Winter Sports Update

Basketball- The team opened the season 2-0 with road wins at Snyder and St. Anthony before competing at the Union Catholic Christmas tournament. (They are currently 2-4 which can be avoided). The team which is paced by senior and student council president **Gabriella Fortune** has two promising freshmen which makes for a bright future for the Blue Devils. S.D.A. played the first of ten home games at St. Peter's Prep when they battled Dickinson.

Indoor Track & Field- Coming off a Cross Country season highlighted by a meet at Disney's Wide World of Sports and a 33rd city title in 37 years the team has competed at three meets thus far. The team led by first team all state parochial performer **Camille Bertholon '16** performed well as the team traveled to Providence, Rhode Island for the Rhode Island Invitational. S.D.A. which was the only New Jersey team in attendance competed in Providence over the break as they have each year since 1987. The team traveled to the Ivy League's Dartmouth College (Hanover, New Hampshire) where SDA first competed at in 1985. The team recently won the Hudson County Relays for an astounding 13th year in a row and the 18th time in 21 year since the meet was reinstituted in 1993.

The team will vie for the Parochial B State Relays 100th City team title in the Jersey City Armory on January 19. The defending county champions will try to earn that title on January 31 and have state, eastern and National meets later in the season.

Swimming- The vastly improved Aqua Devils under the direction of second year coach Trey McGraw have practiced and competed well thus far. With veteran leadership and an infusion of exciting new comers the team finished second at the Swimming Bees Invitational which was SDA's best finish there in more than five years. The team which trailed only Union City has already defeated the Soaring Eagles in a dual meet. Things are looking up for our revived and flourishing swim team.

Dance Team - Congratulations to seniors **Teresa Cartagena** and **Barbara Jean McNutt** who have been named to the New Jersey Cheerleading and Dance Coaches Association prestigious All State Team. These seniors are two of only four dancers who are part of the 16-member All State Team. The 16 members of the team were chosen from over sixty applications. The girls were recognized at a brunch at the Marriott Forrestal in Princeton held on December 6, and will be presented with a plaque at the NJCDCA State Championship in March. This is the 8th consecutive year that SDA has been represented on the NJCDCA All-State Team.
