# Named Scholarships – the Gift that Keeps on Giving

Every year, Saint Dominic Academy receives donations to the scholarship fund in honor of someone or as a memorial in someone's memory. When an alumna dies, family members who knew how much the school meant to her will ask others to join them in creating a <u>named</u> scholarship. These gifts can become substantial, due to the number of donors. Once the scholarship fund reaches \$25,000, a portion of the money will be given each year to qualified students. Sometimes the person who establishes the scholarship requires that the recipient meet certain criteria. For example, one of our named scholarships – **The Mary** Cunningham Scholarship – is only for a student from Sacred Heart Parish in Jersey City; another specifies that the recipient must excel in math and science. Sometimes a scholarship is established to honor the memory of a person associated with the Academy, like The Sister Eileen Imelda **Scholarship**. Another one has been created to help a student who might have to leave the school because of an unexpected financial difficulty – **The Isabelle Wolf Scholarship**. One of our oldest and largest scholarships -- The Fred and Alexandra

Arrigotti Memorial Fund - was opened many years ago by the Arrigotti's, a couple from Jersey City, who had no personal connection to Saint Dominic Academy, but who wanted to make it possible for bright students in need from Jersey City to attend the Academy. As of today, Saint Dominic Academy has fourteen named scholarships that contribute thousands of dollars each year to our scholarship fund.

Because we invest the funds that come to the school for named scholarships, we know that the original gift will last a long time, especially when people continue to add to it over the years. Each year we are able to award scholarships to qualified students because someone thought about honoring someone's memory by establishing a scholarship in that person's name - what a wonderful way to keep that memory alive!

At this time of year, when you might be preparing to pay "Uncle Sam" what you owe, or thinking about ways to reduce your tax obligation to the government, you might consider a charitable deduction to the Academy, or naming the school as the beneficiary of a life insurance policy. You

may want to name the school as a beneficiary in your will, knowing that someday you will make one last gift to the school you love.

If you are celebrating a major reunion year this year you might want to make a significant donation to the Academy in appreciation for all the ways the school made you a better person. Three years ago an alumna who was celebrating her 40th Reunion established the **Sister M. Victorine Scholarship** so that some young girl could have a full four-year scholarship to attend SDA. She said she wanted to give back to the school that awarded her a scholarship years ago, so she could realize her dream.

Private schools like Saint Dominic Academy constantly seek new ways to increase the amount of money available for scholarships. We rely on the affection and good will of our thousands of alumnae and their families who want to see the school they love continue to "Empower young women for leadership" for years to come. We hope that our list of named scholarships will get longer each year, as more people choose to give the gift that keeps on giving a named scholarship!

# Track & Field Wins First Ever **State Championship!**

ongratulations to our SDA State Champions! The SDA Indoor Track & Field Team team captured its first title and became the first girls team from Hudson County to win a State Championship. Saint Dominic received a sparkling triple from Senior Camile Bertholon, and Junior Malia Grey had two wins en route to a 57-43 victory over defending champion Villa Walsh. The championship was held on February 20 at the NJSIAA Non-Public Track and Field Championship at the Bennett Center in Toms River.

Bertholon (photo right) won the 1,600, the 800 and 3.200 and Grey captured the high jump and 55 meter hurdle. This is Coach John Nagel's 38th season at Saint Dominic Academy. Congratulations to Coach, Camille, Malia and all the SDA Team members!
